Throughout 2011, Security Awareness Induction Training (SAIT) will continue to provide courses for all United Nations (UN) personnel who wish to work in Iraq. The training will strengthen the participants' understanding of the security situation and in doing so their ability to react to situations.

SAIT courses consist of two days intensive classroom instruction and two days of practical field exercises. In addition, SAIT runs refresher courses for those staff members who have taken the course before but have not entered Iraq for one full year.

In 2011, SAIT will aim to train a total of 480 students, whilst providing refresher courses to a further 144 participants. Thus far, five courses have been conducted and 64 students are now ready to be deployed.
